

**2012 Le Bertille Rosso di
Montepulciano**

With pretty tones of cherry and toasted nut, the 2012 Rosso di Montepulciano reveals soft layers and ripe fruit with spice and leather at the back. The wine offers a rich, layered effect that puts a premium on fruit ripeness. Overall, it's a simple interpretation, but it offers a nice portrait of this beautiful Tuscan territory. This wine could hold a few more years, but is designed for near-term drinking.

**2010 Le Bertille Vino Nobile di
Montepulciano**

The 2010 Vino Nobile di Montepulciano reveals a pretty combination of ripe fruit and oak spice that makes for a fitting duality. There's a greater sense of overall integration in the cooler 2010 vintage with more varietal identity. Coffee grinds and licorice add nice finishing touches and give the wine a sense of depth and evolution. Crisp acidity makes this a faithful proponent of Montepulciano tradition.
